Acquiring Genstat for teaching and learning

This is a free statistics package. You can install it at school and can also give it to students to take home to put on their own computers.

The process is as follows:

- Go to http://www.vsni.co.uk/software/genstat-teaching
- Send an e-mail requesting to trial GTL from memory for 30 days
- Download once sent e-mail
- If you are fairly serious then I suggest you then apply straight away. Its quite a long contract but I only scanned and sent the page that was signed. You then get a licence for a year
